

Friends in Christ,

Some of you will remember that in August I traveled to Ocean Grove, New Jersey to spend a few days with my college roommate, Cindy, and her partner, Judy. They spend the summer in a tent dwelling in that historically Methodist village by the Atlantic Ocean. The second evening of my visit, I had the wonderful experience of attending an annual Ocean Grove tradition: a Christmas pageant

on the beach. This was no small-scale pageant! It included a narrator, song leader, a small orchestra, the Holy Family, many shepherds and sheep, stable animals, two-person camels of all sizes, Wise ones, and (my guess) about forty angels making up the heavenly host. The diverse cast were well-rehearsed and seemed as if on cue to float over the sand to their places as the story of Christ's birth was read and sung for hundreds of onlookers to enjoy. And that was just one of the many wonderful experiences we shared while together. Hours on the beach, attending daily Bible Hour, walks, visits to local museums and a candy store, sharing stories while rocking on the porch, discussing theology, reconnecting with cherished friends... At one point late in the week Judy commented, "You've brought so much joy to our tent!" My response: "You make me feel right at home!"



During Advent this year, we're all invited to make the journey home. That home is not a geographical place; rather, it's a spiritual space of comfort, belonging, safety, nurture, and love created for us by God through the gift of Jesus, our Messiah. Having moved many times throughout my life and ministry, I often tell folks that the new house only becomes a home when we share a Christmas there-- for the holy season of making room for and welcoming the Christ child creates that space for love like nothing else. Come home for Christmas as you experience God's love living in you!

SPUMC's Children's Ministry Hosts Holiday Cookie Decorating Party!


